

KENTON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

COMMUNITY QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS AND ANALYSIS

NOVEMBER 2015

Introduction

This report summarises the results of the survey, and the steering group will take into account the results as we develop the neighbourhood plan. Every comment and response has been read and recorded.

The report mostly concentrates on the things which people think improving. There are many practical suggestions throughout the responses. On the positive side virtually everyone who responded said that they are satisfied, or very satisfied with the 'general quality of the neighbourhood in Kenton'. (Q4 on the survey). Most respondents use, and very much appreciate, local services such as the post office /shop, other retail businesses and restaurants.

There is some duplication in this report, but we decided to include responses to every question, in the interests of completeness. A summary report will be prepared for the village newsletter and notice boards.

Responses

160 questionnaires were returned, representing around one third of households or 14% of electors over 18. 6 children/young people responded.

Of the 160 adult responses by age group:

58% of responses were from females and 42% from males.

Q1 Please tick box which represents your satisfaction with the current provision.

Dissatisfied responses:

94 (67%) respondents were unhappy with broadband reliability or speed, or mobile phone coverage, or both.

60 (40%) respondents were unhappy with transport / road issues – mainly relating to speed and volume of traffic on the A379.

48 (39%) had issues with parking provision.

25% and 23% respectively expressed dissatisfaction with leisure provision and the 'historic environment'

Q1b Please tell us what improvements you would like to see to services, or what new services are needed.

121 people responded, most of them with multiple comments. Therefore the totals below exceed the number of respondents. 39 people skipped this question.

What do you like about Kenton?

From 160 respondents (including the 6 responses from children) we get the results shown in the table below. Most people mentioned 2 or 3 things they liked, so the total is far higher than the number of respondents.

The following received one or two mentions each: GP services, the car park, the pub, hairdresser, Country Store, allotments, Twinning Association, 'it feels safe here', 'my house'.

What do you not like about Kenton?

Of 160 respondents 48 people mentioned the A 379. Specifically the issues mentioned were:

- Volume of traffic, especially in summer
- Speed of traffic, particularly heading up the hill towards Exeter
- Requests for effective control of speed – cameras, 20mph limit, flashing signs warning of excess speed and better enforcement
- Contrary views about the new lights at Southtown
- Concerns about safety of cyclists and pedestrians in the village 30 mph limit and beyond towards Exeter

The next biggest concern was 17 responses concerned with car parking in the village centre. Complaints included inconsiderate parking, lack of space at busy times in the car park and concern about commercial vehicles.

Inadequate broadband and mobile reception (9 responses) was the next biggest issue, closely followed by worries about the unaffordability of housing (6)

8 people would like to see better general maintenance of the village. They referred to litter clearance, weed killing along the pavements and public footpaths, keeping the brook clear

(to prevent flooding). The Triangle was praised for its tidiness and beauty, but other public areas were thought to be neglected.

Under this (don't like) heading 7 people wanted to see the pub become a true community venue. This also comes up in other sections of the survey.

Other issues mentioned by a small minority – objections to bell ringing and the quarter hour chimes, dog fouling and a suggestion of a shop with a wider range of goods open for longer hours, and on Sundays.

Q6 What are the 3 best things about Kenton?

The responses here were the same as for question 5, 'what do you like?', so no further analysis is required. Many people omitted this question because it duplicates Q5.

Q7 If could change 3 things what would they be and why?

Of the 160 respondents to the Adult questionnaire 99 % (158) of them completed this question and of that we only received just under 10% of responses which fell outside the options provided.

The minimum number of response by category was for Leisure and Tourism and the maximum was for Conservation and Historic Environment.

Analysis

However due to the fact that we asked for a prioritised list from respondents prioritising against response count may not provide a true picture. It is therefore necessary to allocate each of the 3 priorities a value (1= 5, 2=3, 3=1). These values were then multiplied by the number of entries and summed to give an overall adjusted value.

Carrying out this exercise provides the following priority list:

1. Conservation and historic environment	270
2. Health and wellbeing	255
3. Transport / roads	242
4. Housing	194
5. Education	150
6. Footpaths and cycling	117
7. Business and home working	71
8. Leisure and Tourism	45

From this it can be seen that the top 3 priorities for the village are clear and highlighted above and demonstrated how the priorities change through the analysis with Health and Well Being moving above Transport and Roads.

Other Comments

A further 16 comments were provided by respondents to the free text box. The majority of these were used to re-iterate or expand on one of the categories e.g. Improved pavements please, ensure roads are in good order and parking can all be attributed to the Transport and Roads.

Within these comments the most repeated submission (5) related to improvement to communication (broadband and mobile reception).

Other un-associated comments related to the monitoring and upkeep of the village stream and the need for a local police officer as well as mention of a Social / Meeting club.
